The inventory lists provided by the archives in Belarus, Poland, Ukraine, Lithuania and Moldova list the year/ span of documents, followed by the archival numbers. Thus, it is not always possible to identify which archival number corresponds to a particular year or year-span.

Example: 1842/1844; 1857; 1859-1861; 1873
